NEWSLETTER NOTES

The new supplemental band books were introduced to the Southern Province at a daylong band seminar May 6 at **Friedland**. Seventy-five band players spent morning and afternoon sampling some of the 175 tunes that are crammed into the “blue” book. Vom Himmel Hoch (Bach and Gregor versions), a Calypso rhythm, and lots of sharps were blared out. They’re in the new book along with such familiars as *Be Thou My Vision*, *Peace, Perfect Peace*, and *Jerusalem the Golden*. All 175 tunes can be found in the 1995 *Moravian Book of Worship*, and not one is a repeat from the “green” chorale book. So, band, keep the “green,” get the “blue,” do a little homework. And next Easter morn, we can sashay to God’s Acre playing 650 A, Tanzanian melody, while the congregation sings “Mfurahini, halleluya.” (But first ask Dr. Daniel Crews how to pronounce it.)

Speaking of Easter, wasn’t that a glorious Sunrise Service? All around, reports have poured in of large and reverent crowds. The almost shirt-sleeve weather helped, but there was also a noticeable deepening of devotion and especially worshipful experience that lingered long after the last band notes echoed away.

Glowing reports have poured in too about Provincial Synod. One resolution, No. 48, “Reaffirming Salvation in Christ Alone,” was reprinted in its entirety in a number of newsletters. Br. Tim Byerly summed up Synod this way, that “though not all issues were completely resolved, there was a strong sense of the presence of the Savior’s love among us and a genuine desire to listen to each other and to seek resolution to difficult issues in Christian affection. In this regard, the world could learn something from the 2006 Synod of the Southern Province. I know I did.”

Time was, in the Salem church and in the Female Boarding School and in the many Sunday schools, that the Christmas cantata was a high point of the holiday season. **Friedland** will renew that tradition next December with a cantata arranged by its organist, Jason Snipes. It will be distinctly Moravian, with orchestrated Moravian anthems and hymns and scriptural narration to weave the music together.

Now **Bethesda** need not be known as “the church next to By-Ty Florist.” A big new sign boldly proclaims: “Bethesda Moravian Church.” The sign was donated. Now people can easily recognize the only church on Bethesda Road.

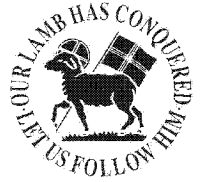

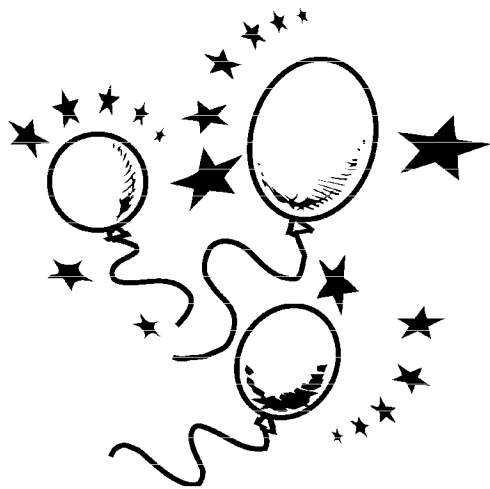

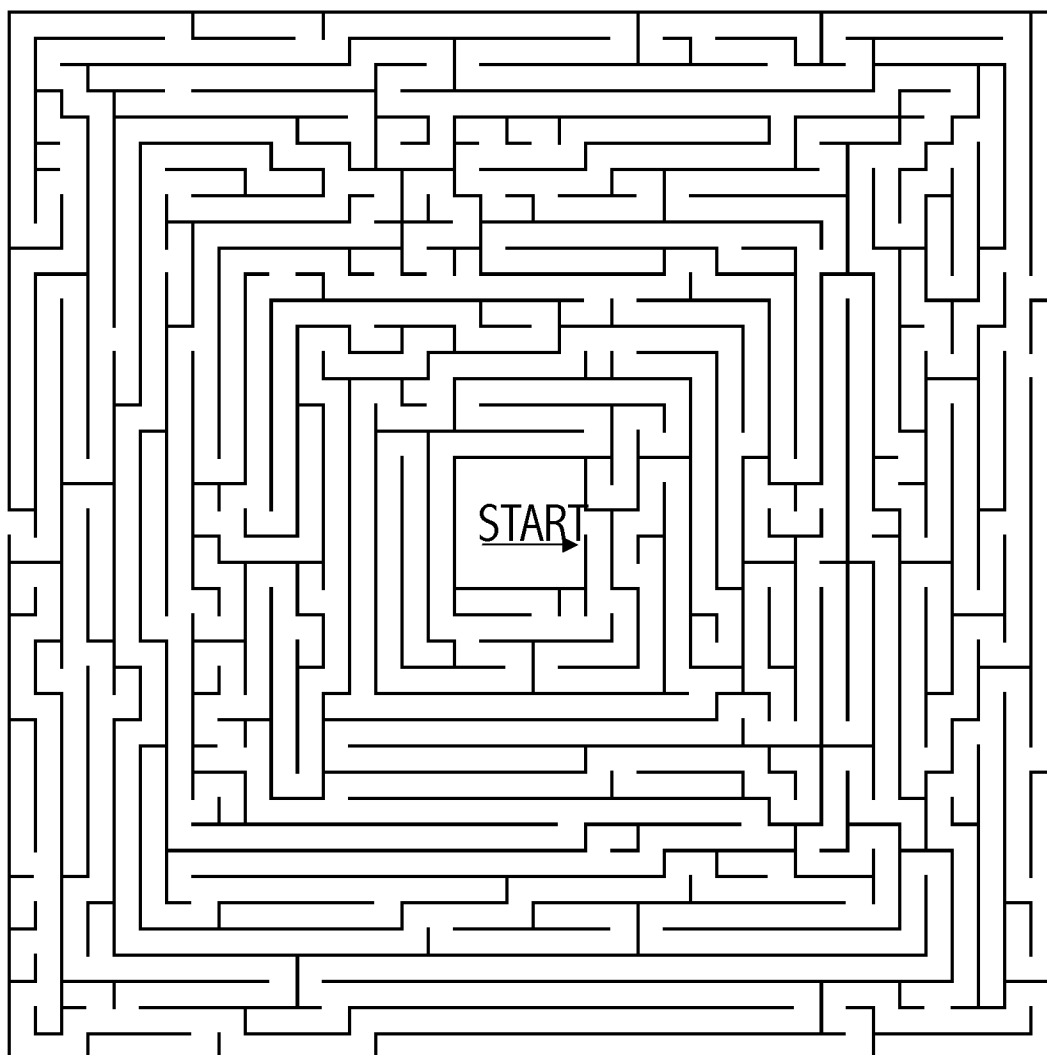
