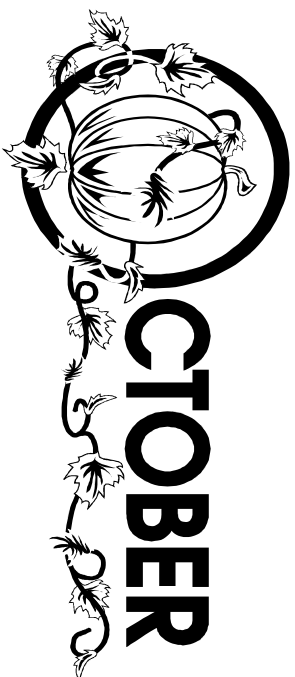

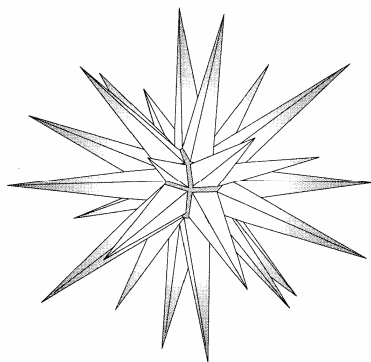

THE MORAVIAN WIDOW'S SOCIETY

The Widow's Society is open to any Moravian male under 60 who is married. The male would never benefit from holding membership, but in case of his death, his Widow would receive a check in September and March. Presently the widows (72 in number) are receiving \$480.00 a year.

Membership is a one time charge of \$100.00 for men 50 and under, and \$5.00 more per year for men between 51 and 59. For example, a man 57 would pay \$135.00.

The Society holds more than \$900,000.00 of high grade stocks and mutual funds.

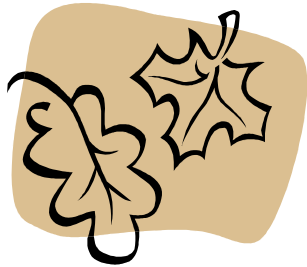

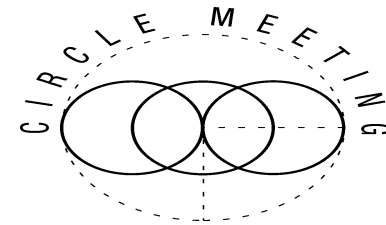
Bethabara's Marketplace

ADOPT A VILLAGE

Mission 550 Adopt A Village Program

As part of the Moravian Church of America's celebration of 550 years of mission outreach and ministry, Bethabara Moravian Church will host a special worship program: Adopt a Village, Giving Hope to AIDS Orphans in Tanzania on Saturday, **November 3rd at 5 PM.** The Rev. Tripp May will conduct a worship service followed by a presentation by Dr. William Hoffman and his wife, Dr. Margaret Kraybill, members of Central Moravian Church in Bethlehem on their work in leading our church's response to HIV/AIDS in Africa and the Caribbean.

Under the leadership of the Hoffmans, a community based orphan program was established in Tanzania in the villages of the Sikonge district and city of Tabora to assist children under the age of 16, who have lost one or both parents to AIDS. Fifteen women, who love children are now administering the program and helping 1,500 children. These women canvass the neighborhoods and identify children requiring care. Provisions are distributed every four to six weeks

including staples such as maize, rice and milk for infants, personal items (sleeping mats, sheets, soap and skin oil); school uniforms and supplies. Medical care is provided through agreements with local medical facilities. The AIDS epidemic has left as many orphans in Africa as there are children under the age of five in the United States.

Adopt a Village, an outreach ministry of the Board of World Missions and the Moravian Church of Western Tanzania is supported by the following Moravian Churches in the Southern Province: Bethabara, Fairview, Friedberg, Fries, First (Greensboro), Good Sheppard (Kernersville), Kernersville, Raleigh, and Home.

Following the worship service and presentation, there will be an opportunity to meet the Hoffmans and learn more about Tanzania, where over half of the Moravians in the world reside. Light refreshments will be provided in the fellowship hall.
